In addition to skiing, snowboarding and tobogganing, the winter wonderland of the Bavarian Forest can be discovered here on hundreds of kilometers of cross-country ski trails and well-developed winter hiking trails.

An Eldorado for passionate cross-country skiers and those who want to become one

Numerous perfectly groomed trails and a well-developed network of trails make the Ferienregion Nationalpark Bayerischer Wald one of the most popular vacation destinations for cross-country skiers. Whether beginner or real pro and whether classic or free technique, everyone will find their favorite trail here.

The stages of the famous Bavarian Forest trail are a highlight and a very special nature experience for passionate cross-country skiers. It stretches for around 150 kilometers through the Bavarian Forest. Particularly practical for all those who find the entire route too long: cross-country skiers can join the trail in many of the 12 communities in the Ferienregion and only ski parts of the Bayerwaldloipe. The return journey to the starting point is either on skis or by public transport. If it's your first time on skis or you're still a little unsure, you can get tips from the experts at one of the many ski schools. It is not absolutely necessary to bring your own equipment, as many ski rental stations make it easy to hire the necessary equipment on site. Whether you are a beginner or an advanced skier, cross-country skiing fans should not miss out on a visit to a night trail. Gliding through the crunching snow under the stars on the floodlit trails and night trails is an unforgettable experience for every cross-country skier. If you prefer to hit the slopes, there are nine ski areas in the Ferienregion with family-friendly mid-mountain slopes for relaxed skiing enjoyment. From easy family runs to challenging World Cup runs on the steep slopes of the Großer Arber, the vacation region offers suitable runs for all abilities. And if you still can't get enough of skiing during the day, you can also whizz down the slopes by floodlight in many places in the evening. The vacation region also has plenty to offer young skiers. Specially trained staff and a 6-seater family chair with the world's first automatic child safety gate on the Arber ensure the necessary safety for young and old. In ArBÄR Kinderland and ArBÄR Zwergenland, the little ones can have fun on gently sloping slopes. Also good to know: With the aktivCARD Bavarian Forest, vacation guests can use many ski lifts free of charge. For example, in the Mitterdorf ski center, on the Glasberg lift in Zwiesel or on the Geißkopf near Bischofsmais. On a winter hike or on an extended snowshoe tour, either with a local forest guide or equipped with the latest hiking maps, or on your own. A variety of winter hiking trails and exciting snowshoe tours are waiting to be discovered. Many of the guided tours take place weekly and can be booked online in the Ferienregion Erlebnisshop. Fancy a little more speed? Then be sure to plan a tobogganing day. You hike uphill and sledge downhill. Winter fun for the whole family is guaranteed. On the other hand, a cozy horse-drawn sleigh ride is a little more comfortable. Wrapped up in warm blankets and with a hot cocoa in your hand, you can enjoy the snowy winter landscape of the Ferienregion Nationalpark Bayerischer Wald in particular comfort. After a few exciting days of winter
